SHOWS HOW CONSERVATIVE NUMBERS /

Based on data from the Congressional Research Servic e, cumulative spending on means-tested federal welfare programs, if converted into cash, would equal \$167.65 per day per household living below the poverty level. By comparison, the median household income in 2011 of \$50,054 equals \$137.13 per day. Additionally, spending on federal welfare benefits, if converted into cash payments, equals enough to provide \$30.60 per hour, 40 hours per week, to each household living below poverty. The median household hourly wage is \$25.03. After accounting for federal taxes, the median hourly wage drops to between \$21.50 and \$23.45, depending on a household's deductions and filing status. State and local taxes further reduce the median household's hourly earnings. By contrast, welfare benefits are not taxed.

THIS STUDY DOES NOT INCLUDE SAVINGS from STD testing, Pap and HPV testing, and HIV testing that minimize future medical costs. It also DOES NOT INCLUDE extra costs of preterm births and low weiight babies born from this population.

This spreadsheet only shows the savings achievied in births that did not occur due to the family planing already in place. IF the government spent and additional 2.37 billion dollars it could expect similar returns and as much as 760,000 of the 1 million abortions currently being done, could be eliminated. 1.1 million new welfare families would not be formed.
